Consider online masters in nursing degree (MSN) to improve your skills as a nurse educator, your knowledge of acute care and your abilities in health systems leadership.

One of the most common MSN concentrations is to become an advanced practice nurse like a nurse practitioner.

Your curriculum will cover some important subject areas including:

- Assessments of outcome and quality management
- Evaluation and research methods
- Leadership in nursing
- Nursing administration
- Health services marketing
- The economics of health services
- Managed care issues
- The organization and management of health care systems
- Healthcare and the law
- Healthcare information systems
- Advanced nursing theory

Many of these Masters of Nursing programs are designed for registered nurses (RN) who have already earned a Bachelor's in Nursing. Some programs also allow for an accelerated RN to MSN online degree.

Two specializations of the Masters in Nursing programs are:

Nurse Educator- This is for those nurses who want to develop other nurses to meet the continually changing, dynamic healthcare environment. If you're an RN who wants to be on the cutting edge of clinical practice, who wants to stay in an intellectually challenging environment and hopes to have a say in the future of healthcare this might be a good area for you.

Adult Nurse Practitioner- This is for those professionals who want to apply their practical nursing skills to help their adult patients. If you want to manage your adult patient's long term health care plan, want to educate and counsel your patients and like making evidence based decisions, you may want to focus on this specialty.

Online Masters of Nursing Degree FAQ's

What are the requirements to enroll in a Masters of Nursing Program?

The requirements are the same as if you attended an on-campus program. This will include letters of recommendation, transcripts and an acceptable grade point average.

What about the clinical requirements of the programs?

Often, for a Masters of Nursing Program, as much as 500 clinical hours can be required. Check the requirements for the distance learning degree you're interested in. Many times, you can take the clinicals in the place where you live. In other cases, you might have to attend the college to complete your clinicals.
